# Sts. Michael, Gabriel and Raphael

Angels—messengers from God—appear frequently in Scripture, but only Michael, Gabriel
and Raphael are named.

- Michael appears in Daniel's vision as "the great prince" who defends Israel against its enemies; in the Book of Revelation, he leads God's armies to final victory over the forces of evil. Devotion to Michael is the oldest angelic devotion, rising in the East in the fourth
- century. The Church in the West began to observe a feast honoring Michael and the angels in the fifth century.
- Gabriel also makes an appearance in Daniel's visions, announcing Michael's role in God's plan. His best-known appearance is an encounter with a young Jewish girl named Mary,
- who consents to bear the Messiah.
- Raphael's activity is confined to the Old Testament story of Tobit. There he appears to
   guide Tobit's son Tobiah through a series of fantastic adventures which lead to a threefold
   happy ending: Tobiah's marriage to Sarah, the healing of Tobit's blindness and the restora-
- tion of the family fortune.
- The memorials of Gabriel (March 24) and Raphael (October 24) were added to the Roman
   calendar in 1921. The 1970 revision of the calendar joined their feasts to Michael's.
- Each of these archangels performs a different mission in Scripture: Michael protects; Gabriel announces; Raphael guides. Earlier belief that inexplicable events were due to the
- actions of spiritual beings has given way to a scientific world-view and a different sense of
- cause and effect. Yet believers still experience God's protection, communication and guid-
- ance in ways which defy description. We cannot dismiss angels too lightly.
- "For the honor we pay the angelic creatures in whom you delight debounds to your own
  surpassing glory, and by their great dignity and splendor you show how infinitely great you
  are, to be exalted above all things, through Christ our Lord" (*Roman Missal*, Preface for

# **A Word From Father Thomas**

The parable of the two sons draws our attention to the importance of doing the will of God. Doing the will of God is imperative because "not everyone says to me, 'Lord, Lord' will enter the Kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father in heaven" (Mt 7:21). Obedience to the will of God guarantees our entrance into the Kingdom of God; it ensures a life of communion with God which is the purpose of our life. The first son who did the will of his father is fit to enter the Kingdom.

Today's readings specify the dispositions necessary to do the will of God. First of all we must be docile to God. To be docile means to recognize God as God and to accept our dependence on him. The second disposition necessary is that of humility. Humility is the recognition that all that we are and all that we have are God's gift to us. Another disposition required is that of conversion. Conversion opens up the possibility to enter the Kingdom even at the last moment as in the case of the good thief. We may have many justifications, perhaps all of them justified, to refuse to do the will of God. But let us remember that the greatest thing that we can do is to do well and with great diligence the will of God.
