The Word From Father Thomas

Jesus tells of a debtor whose large debt is forgiven by the king, but who refuses to forgive someone who owes him so much less (Mt 18:21-35).

A longtime friend yelled at me because I had said something that touched a nerve and set him off. His reaction was over the top and unjustifiable.

The next day I expected a phone call of apology. Would I yell back? Would I offer a half-hearted forgiveness, the thin appearance of mercy wrapped around a chewy center of accusation? Would I feed on some juicy resentment?

There is a sick sweetness in hanging onto hurt; a feeling of superiority when you are owed an apology; a sense of power in thinking you can hold someone hostage to their si; and it is all an empty lie!

How many times had I yelled or snapped or hurt people simply because they caught me at the wrong time in the wrong mood. Were I held bound to these sing, there is no way I could ever pay the debt.

I picked up the phone, called a friend, and said to him, "About last night, it was not a big deal." He thanked me and we spoke briefly.

After we hung up, I realized I had just thrown away my superiority, my power, my "right" to resentment.

And I walked out of prison, a free man!

I hope such a short sentence will become the rule in my life, rather than the exception.



Broadcasting our beliefs




We're supposed to spread the Good News every chance we get, but what about on bumper stickers, clothing, social media, and other places? I see religious street art and think it's disgraceful, but my son says you have to get people's attention any way you can. What do you think?

Decorum and respect have their lines and limits, but sometimes it's hard to say exactly where they are. Years ago there was an outrage over a clothing manufacturer that stitched Jesus' words on the seat of their line of blue jeans: "Come, follow me!"

We should enjoy our freedoms of speech and religious expression in morally and legally acceptable ways. I think the wearers of T-shirts and the drivers of cars with Christian words on them are sincere. In fact, it takes some nerve to publicly display "I love Jesus." Surely many of the eyes that see this quietly say, "I do, too." And what do we do: leave the field of messaging to people who corrupt our eyes with lies and indecency?

Just remember: Before shirts and stickers, it is God who converts people, very often through those who live and breathe the words—those who really, quietly, and clearly know and love Jesus. He has always relied on flesh-and-blood witnesses to lovingly share his name. This is what it really means to bear witness to Jesus Christ.
