THE HOLY INNOCENTS December 28

The feast of The Holy Innocents commemorates the boys slain instead of Jesus by King Herod the Great (Mt 2:16-18) to eliminate the threat to his throe form the newborn king. In contrast to the Magi's welcome, Herod's murderous rage foreshadows the opposition that Jesus will later meet, culminating in his crucifixion by the Romans. To escape Herod's massacre, the holy family became refugees in Egypt. This unique episode also echoes Moses' rescue from the slaughter of the Hebrew children by the Pharoah (Ex 2:1-10). Like a new Moses, Jesus will lead his people on a new exodus journey into God's promised kingdom. May we do all we can to lessen the suffering of children and refugees.

The Word From Father Thomas

ENCLOSED IN A WOMB

He who encloses the world is enclosed in a womb; the Author of nature is born; the Creator of human beings and of periods of time becomes the Firstborn of humanity; the Treasure of heaven is clothed with the swaddling clothes of the indigent; he who makes thunderbolts fly gives an infant's cry; in a manger lies the One to whom all creation lies subject.



O man, do you not realize by what means Christ pursues you in order to call you back? Dear Padre

DECEMBER 24, 2017

Anantiphon in the Christian breviary states, "The angel Gabriel was sent to the Virgin Mary, who was engaged to be married to Joseph" (December 20). Was she married or not when Jesus was conceived?

Much of the confusion is due to what constituted marriage at the time of Jesus.

Mary was betrothed to Joseph when she was found to be pregnant through the power of the Holy Spirit. During the usual betrothal period of a year, the woman remained with her family. However, the bond between the couple was already as permanent as marriage. That's why Mary was legally known as Joseph's wife, even though they didn't yet live together or have all the rights belonging to a husband and wife. In fact, the arrangement during betrothal was so binding that it could only be terminated in divorce.

Moreover, in that patriarchal society, a betrothed woman who had sexual relations with anyone other than her husband was accused of adultery. Had Joseph ended this betrothal in disgrace, Mary would have been deprived of marriage for the rest of her life and dependent on her extended family upon her father's death. But Joseph was an upright man who intended to divorce her quietly without publicly stating the reason, in order to spare Mary and her family's reputation. That's when an angel appeared to him in a dream and told him to have no fear about taking Mary as his wife, for the Child was conceived by the Holy Spirit (Matthew 1:20).

Like Mary, we await Jesus. With her, let us say yes to him, celebrating the one who has established that house where we celebrate today!
