The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches:

"All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heav-

en." (CCC 1030) "This teaching is also based on the practice of prayer for the dead, already mentioned in Sacred Scripture: 'Therefore Judas Maccabeus] made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin.'" (CCC 1032) "From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead: "Let us help and commemorate them. If Job's sons were purified by their father's sacrifice, why would we doubt that our offerings for the dead bring them some consolation? Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them." (CCC 1032)

Mass intentions are a long-standing tradition in the Catholic Church. It is usually considered that special graces are obtained for whom the Mass is prayed for. Masses are offered for many reasons, for special intentions, the souls in purgatory, in remembrance for someone who is deceased, or in honor of a birthday or anniversary, etc. By tradition, most Masses offered around the world are offered specifically in memory of a loved one and as a prayer to be offered for the re-

pose of the soul of the individual. How do you get a Mass intention prayed for your loved one? Well, you go to the parish office or call 217-784-4671. Talk with Lori Gale when you decide upon a particular Mass date. The date could be the date the of the loved ones passing or the loved ones birthday. You then give a small donation of \$10 and receive a Mass card to give to the family of the person for whom you are having the Mass prayed for. This practice of applying the grace of the Holy Sacrifice of a Mass for the repose of the soul again goes back to the earliest days of the Church. Tertullian (writing before 216 A.D.) mentioned that Christians offered sacrifices for the dead on the anniversary of their loved one's death, and that they prayed for the souls of their deceased spouses, offering the Mass on the anniversary of that spouse's death. The Mass is even more efficacious for a person's soul when that person is still living, so you don't have to wait for the person to die to have a Mass prayed for him/her!



A Thirst for Souls

During Holy Mass, I (St. Faustina) saw the Lord Jesus nailed upon the cross amidst great torments. A soft moan issued from His Heart. After some time, He (Jesus) said, I thirst. I thirst for the salvation of souls. Help Me, My daughter, to save souls. Join your sufferings to My Passion and offer them to the heavenly Father for sinners (Diary, 1032).

(Prayer) Lord Jesus, I hear Your cry of I Thirst. Help me to offer even the little sufferings I endure, as well as the big ones, for the salvation of souls. With Your help, I may join them to Your Passion and offer them to the Heavenly Father for sinners.

Please try to pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet every day at 3:00pm for this is when Our Lord Jesus Christ gave s his life for sins. If you cannot pray at that time, take at least a moment at 3:00pm to feel the inconceivable, abundant Mercy that falls from heaven every day at 3:00pm for the whole world. Jesus, I Trust In You!
