

MONTH OF OUR LADY OF SORROWS (MATER DOLOROSA)

The Church dedicates the month of September to Our Lady of Sorrows, also known as Mater Dolorosa (Mother of Sorrows). This devotion recalls the Blessed Virgin Mary's spiritual martyrdom in virtue of her perfect union with the Passion of Christ. This was her role in salvation history, and what merited her place as the spiritual Mother of all Christians. This is symbolized by a single sword, or seven swords, piercing Mary's suffering heart, as foretold in Simeon's prophecy. Traditionally the Church meditates on the "Seven Sorrows" of our Blessed Mother: the prophecy of Simeon; the Holy Family's flight into Egypt; the loss of the Child Jesus for three days; the meeting of Mary and Jesus as he carried his cross; Jesus' crucifixion and death; Jesus' sacred body taken down from the cross; and Jesus' burial. The feast of Our Lady of Sorrows is September 15th.



Good News!

September 5, 2021 Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time (B) Is 35:4-7a; Jas 2:1-5; Mk 7:31-37

Deep in the heart of each of us is a desire for a perfect world—a world of peace and harmony, where life flourishes and people care for one another. From beginning to end, our religious tradition promises that such a world is just ahead of us. Today's readings assure us that physical obstacles will not prevent its accomplishment, because the graciousness of God is stronger than any other power.

Today's reading from Isaiah instructs us: "Be strong, do not fear!" (35:4). It encourages us to believe in this promise of ultimate fulfillment and to trust that God will see it through. Our focus changes slightly in the Gospel passage. What was a promise of the future for Isaiah bursts forth as a reality in the Gospel, where the healing of broken bodies and troubled lives is realized by the warm words and gentle touch of Jesus.

Do such miracles really happen? Or are these fanciful stories that provide hope for people with little scientific understanding? Are miracles real? Of course they are. However, their true meaning might be much more profound than we realize. A miracle is a manifestation of divine power far beyond human control or comprehension. It is an experience of being made whole again, an occurrence in which peace and harmony are reestablished. Sometimes a miracle is spectacular; at other times it is far too deep to be seen. But always it is God working in our lives to create us anew. Feast Day September 15th Our Lady of Sorrows

The Mother of God revealed to St. Bridget "I look around upon all who are in the world, to see if there may be any who will pity me, and meditate upon my sorrows, and truly, I find very few. Therefore, my daughter, though I am forgotten by many, at least do not you forget me; behold my anguish, and imitate, as far as you can, my grief."

Let us not then, ever forget her sighs and groans - her bitter pains and sorrows. Let us fix them deeply in our mind that, day by day we may recall them, meditate on them, and in this manner, we will imitate her virtues, share in her merits, and obtain her special protection. Of this we can be certain, to the extent that we have compassion for Our Lady in her sufferings and meditate on her great sorrows, while thus our love for her grows daily "more and more," so also will our love for Jesus crucified still more continually increase.

"The grief of Mary was so great that, were it divided among all men, it would suffice to cause their immediate death." (St. Bernardine of Sienna)

Our Lord Jesus Christ, Himself, revealed to Blessed Veronica of Binasco "My daughter, tears shed for My Passion are dear to Me; but as I loved My Mother Mary with an immense love, the meditation on the torments which She endured at My death is even more pleasing to Me."

Mary will show us a grateful love, and, with her own most marvelous blessing, will bless those who, by compassion of her Sorrows, show themselves the most truly to be her children, and give the sweetest consolation

4) Mary Meets Jesus on the Way to Calvary (23:27) The meeting between Jesus and his mother on the way of the cross is

not recorded in any of the Gospels, but we know that there were women who followed him on the way and we know that Mary was at the foot of the cross with St John, so it isn't unreasonable that she and Jesus should have met as he was carrying the cross. It is also a strong tradition of the Church, commemorated both in the devotion of the Seven Sorrows of Mary and in the Stations of the Cross.

5) Jesus Dies on the Cross – John 19:25-37)

6) Mary Receives Jesus (Matthew 27:55-56) Only in the 13 station of the Cross do we hear specifically Of Jesus being placed in this Mothers arms.

7) Jesus is Placed in the Tomb (Luke 23:50-56)
