The Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

The Incarnation of Christ our Lord is not a celebration of a single day, but of an entire season. So the next two weeks inites us to deeply experience and reflect on the mystery of "God-made-Man." Christmas Day features three forms, plus a vigil Masses. In these Masses, we incounter the

vulnerablity and intimacy of Mother and Child on that cold dark night in Bethlehem (House of Bread). During the long night, the miraculous birth is announced by the song of the angels to the local community of humble sheperds, who come to do him homage (a special honor or respect shown publicly). From there, the manifestation of God -in-the-Flesh widens out, little by little, to recongnize the sanctity of the family, the first community of divine"belonging" with the human family, on the Feast of the Holy Family. On the Solemnity of Mary, The Mother of God, we reflect on Jesus beloning to the nation of God's Holy People as he is presented at the **Temple** and receives the sign of Circumcision. The knowledge of Jesus is further made know to man as we celebrate Jesus being manifest to all the nations in the Feast of the Epipha**ny**, exemplified by the visitation of the foreigners who were inspired to faith by the light of the star. The Christmas season is fulfilled in the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord, where Christ reveals his Lorship over all peoples in all timesas he establishes Baptism as the sign of membership in a universal Church that invites all men and womento receive adoption as sons and daughter of God. To consider the mystery of the Incarnation as a feast of Christmas Day alone forgets that the Incornation is, above all, a divine plan of ever -widening revelation of God unto our own day in the mystery of the Church.

Tree Farm for the generous donations of 3 trees and 2 door hangings. They are beautiful.




Daily Reflections from the Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska
