

Message from Fr. Nestor Sanchez Sunday XXII in Ordinary time

Dear brothers and sisters.

Today in the Sunday readings, we find a contrast to the previous Sunday in which Jesus rewards Peter's faith by choosing him as his vicar. Now we see how Jesus rejects him for his petty and short-sighted ideas. Peter wants to dissuade the Lord from accepting

the Passion. He does not do it because he does not love Christ, on the contrary: he does not want Him to suffer and does not understand His words.

Sometimes we find ourselves in this same situation. It is always natural to reject suffering in our lives, especially if we see our beloved ones struggling physically or spiritually.

Matthew, in this part of the gospel, is trying to tell us that the cross is beloved by God. Furthermore, he wants to tell us that Jesus not only had awareness of this, but he willingly went to meet death because he understood that it was part of God's plan, and he embraced it precisely in the light of the divine plan, as a service.

When Jesus spoke of the need to carry one's cross every day, what did he mean? "His cross" should not be understood as the barbaric instrument of torture or just resignation to our sufferings as if there were no hope in them. The cross of Jesus simply means every effort that makes us faithful fulfillers of the Father's will and that is assumed and carried out out of love. Without that perspective and motivation, there can be no cross in the sense expressed by Jesus. Understood according to him, it is something transformed and transformative of all human realities.

Teilhard-de-Chardin, a philosopher and theologian, wrote to someone who complained about the weight of the crosses in their life dedicated to God: "Perhaps you are looking at the cross in the wrong way and only see two crossed sticks. Turn the cross around, and you will see Jesus nailed to it out of love. Then everything will change in meaning, and you will understand it all."

May the Lord grant us the strength to take up our cross and embrace with love whatever He permits to enter our lives.
